1/22 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs. R. Cockburn and Cllr M. Grainger.

2/22 MINUTES

The Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 4th May, 2021were approved as a correct record.

Before opening the floor for comments and questions from parish members the Chair read a statement to clarify the reasons for moving the agenda item relating to the noticeboard to the Open Meeting.

Due to the fact that the Parish Council has already been threatened with legal proceedings this action had been taken to protect the parish council and the parties involved.

3/22 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION/OPEN SESSION

The following matters were raised:

Recent issues with notices being removed from the notice boards in Ireby and Uldale and community notices being covered by other notices.

- The Clerk would make enquiries with a local joiner what options are available for the noticeboard in Ireby, whether doors can be fitted to the board with one side to be lockable.
- Commercial advertisers would be requested to try to limit the size of any notices to A5 size.
- The Parish Council would seek advice from the Borough Council regarding the threat of legal proceedings made against it.

A request whether the Parish Council could identify an area of community ground for some swings and to grow a community orchard. The correspondence also suggested that money was available from the Festival Committee that could be used to fund this.

The Parish Council would respond advising

- Any land within the ownership of the Parish Council would not be suitable for the use suggested.
- The other land suggested was in private ownership
- The school playground is open for use out of school hours
- The parish member should make their own enquiries with the Festival Committee whether they have any left-over money

Correspondence regarding the damage caused to the Church when a limb from a tree in a neighbouring property fell against the Church during a storm in December 2021.

 A response would be sent advising that this matter does not fall within the remit of the Parish Council and is a matter for the parties' insurance companies.
